### Anika Robbins, Founder, President & CEO

Anika Robbins is a 25 year business veteran and community servant. She is the Founding President & CEO of the ANIKA Foundation. As Chair of the Minneapolis Commission on Civil Rights (2018-2020), she led the Commission through the tumultuous events surrounding the murder of George Floyd, bridging community & police relations, galvanizing community outreach and resource distribution through the establishment of the COVID-19 Task Force. She instituted policies including advocating for public oversight of police technology, ensuring the protection of small BIPOC businesses through the Small and Underutilized Business program, race relations, addressing implicit bias, passing resolutions banning Islamophobia, and supporting global human rights protections through the UN Task Force. She also served on the Citizens Advisory Council led by former City of Minneapolis Chief of Police, Medaria Arradondo. As a Minnesota Voice and Roy Wilkins Fellow, respectively, she founded Black Votes Matter MN, a non-partisan voter engagement initiative designed to increase voter turnout, develop leaders and increase representation of women and people of color in government. She served as the Cultural Community Engagement Chair for the State of Minnesota's Census 2020 Initiative and subsequent redistricting efforts. As a Researcher, Program Developer and Mentor, she leads the design and implementation of several of the Foundation's programs and initiatives.



### Nicole Wright, Treasurer

Nicole Wright is the Vice President, National Strategic Markets & Affordable Lending, Business Development Manager. U.S. Bank Her career spans several years in banking and real estate. She's a funder member of the Northside Funders' Group, City of Lakes Community Land Trust and Bii Gii Win Community Development Loan Fund.



### Prince Corbett, Board Chair

Prince Corbett serves in the role of Racial and Health Equity Administrator at Ramsey County. He is a human services professional with over 13 year's experience in the non-profit and public sectors where he primarily worked on the implementation of racial equity workforce development programs. He holds a Master of Public Administration from Metropolitan State University and completed the Equity Works Leadership Institute offered through the Future Services Institute at the U of MN Humphrey School of Public Affairs. Corbett was awarded a Bush Fellowship where he is currently serving a 24 month term. He wants to inspire greater urgency and build new coalitions to close the income and wealth gap for black residents in the twin cities.

## A Message from ANIKA!

**Meeting the Moment** 

2024 was an exciting year for us!

Stretching out a bit, we expanded engagement in St. Cloud, Duluth and St.Paul. The year kicked-off with an agency-wide training in St. Cloud, preparing teams for our statewide engagement efforts promoting health & wellness, civic engagement and economic empowerment. Our Juneteenth Celebration kicked it up a notch at our new site at Minnesota's State Capitol in St.Paul, featuring R&B legends Dave Hollister & Troop with incredible support from the Minnesota Humanities Center, Minnesota Department of Health and Ramsey County Public Health. As part of our civic engagement and health equity focus, we served over 5,000 Minnesotans over the Juneteenth holiday! Delivering critical health, wellness, nonpartisan civic education, and access to essential needs and resources.

We continue to organize - on mission - through our economic empowerment levers TEXTURE Youth Social Enterprise and Jump-Start. Connecting youth to critical life and soft skills-building, mentorship and stabilizing households with rental support, food, transportation and wraparound support. Not to mention, we contract with over 75 women and Black-owned businesses each year to deliver our programs and services.

The Quality Life MN initiative cast a broad net across the State, connecting Minnesotans to impactful tools and information promoting breast cancer and heart health awareness, sexual health interventions and overall healthy lifestyle resources for the whole family! We welcome collaborations with CentraCare and EssentiaHealth and the MN SAGE program.

Our civic engagement work went deeper than ever! Collaborations with organizations like Delta Sigma Theta, Inc, Phi Beta Sigma, Inc, OneMN and others. Our highly acclaimed Black Votes Matter MN Voter Guide was in high demand, we had to publish more copies to meet demand! We appreciate support from the Pohlad Family Foundation, Minnesota Voice and others.

The ANIKA Foundation marked 16 years of service to Minnesotans in 2024! We couldn't do this work without our team, our network and support from organizations like the McKnight Foundation, Hennepin County, Minnesota Housing and Minnesota Department of Health, whose support advances our mission - and more importantly - our reach to help us continue meeting the moment.

## A Note from Our Board Chair



Drince Corbett

In 2024, I had the honor of being elected Board Chair for The Anika Foundation. I joined the board in 2023 because I strongly believe in our mission to create a multicultural society through: increased health access and Equity, economic empowerment and civic engagement.

Reflecting on our work, I'm reminded of Tupac Shakur's words, "It's time to heal our women, be real to our women." In 2024, The Anika Foundation engaged over 300 people and reached nearly 1.5 million more through a multimedia breast cancer awareness campaign made possible by the Eliminating Health Disparities Initiative grant from Minnesota Department of Health. Not only did we build network connections with healthcare providers like CentraCare, we issued stipends for mammogram completion, and connected more to free and sliding fee scale services as provided through the Minnesota SAGE program. Partnerships with breast cancer advocacy groups like the African American Breast Cancer Alliance (AABCA) and Pink Ladies MN, advanced our goals to expand support networks to Women around the State.

My personal experience with student debt motivated me to seek scholarships, like the Reatha Clark King Endowed Scholarship, which helped finance my education. In 2024, The Anika Foundation awarded over \$30,000 in scholarships, and over \$100,000 in housing assistance, food, transportation and essential needs, and supported entrepreneurs to the tune of \$100,000 in capacity-building and trade. Staff and contractors were paid above minimum wage from \$20-\$75/hour.

The Anika Foundation continued its commitment to civic engagement, publishing over 7,500 Black Votes Matter (BVM) guides in 2024, reaching thousands more digitally. While we are transitioning the BVM initiative out of our core work, it will continue through other channels, as we refine our broader approach to civic engagement.

As we look ahead, I am filled with hope and determination. The progress we've made, despite the challenges, is proof that when communities come together, we can create meaningful and lasting change. Every step forward brings us closer to a society where health, opportunity, and justice are accessible to all. The work we've done this year is a testament to our commitment. Together, we will continue to build a brighter future, where the collective strength of our efforts can overcome any obstacle. Let's move forward with optimism, knowing that we are paving the way for a better tomorrow.

## **Economic Empowerment**

The ability to secure economic stability is the bedrock of the American Dream.

We're committed to convening conversations and access points to opportunities around wealth creation through homeownership, business development and investments. Programs like Community Empowered! provide wraparound support with food, housing and pathways to employment, business development and homeownership. A successful mindset is the foundation for personal and professional success. It's important to plant seeds in our youth - early - so that they begin to believe in their own success and make solid plans for their future. Our social enterprise program, TEXTURE, initiates these conversations early, exposing school-aged youth to STEAM and social enterprise programs with critical life and soft skills development to scholars ages 12-21. We also connect them to additional wrap-around support and resources.



### Taking Up Space: Expanding the VOTE BYM



**Black Votes Matter MN Becomes A Stand Alone Agency** 

When we established Black Votes Matter MN in 2015 in response to the murder of Jamar Clarke and the civil unrest that followed, we knew then that we were on to something.

10 years later, over 200,000 voters engaged through phone banks, doorknocking and the distribution of over 75,000 copies of our renowned voter guide, BVM has grown to have a life of its own. What started as part of our civic engagement program, has grown to have its own presence and supporters - beyond the ANIKA Foundation.

"I created Black Votes Matter MN to highlight pathways to power beyond protest." says Anika Robbins, Founder of Black Votes Matter MN and President of the ANIKA Foundation. Robbins designed a nonpartisan voter education curriculum, published an annual voter guide to help voters particularly new voters - understand political processes, cycles and the candidates vying for votes.

"I'm extremely proud of what we've built', continues Robbins. "Our voter guide and information toolkits and forms have been used in schools, social service agencies, churches, and others. It's helped even seasoned voters make sense of ballot measures, complicated policies and connects them with updates in their region." Our goal was always to help people make informed decisions and explore alternate ways of engaging policymakers to advocate for their wants and needs.'

To all of our partners around the state, our canvassing team, field directors, data coordinators and funders, thanks for riding with us! Stay tuned for the next move.....


