In addition to offering technical skills, our programs promote self-advocacy, financial independence, leadership and legacy development that empower women and families for generations to come.

As an emerging organization, we learned a lot about our constituents over the past 5 years and the issues that matter to them and their families. We value and appreciate the mutual exchange of wisdom and resources shared by our constituents, funders, volunteers and staff ... fulfilling our mission to serve as a connector in a more meaningful way!

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT



Black Votes Matter MN

Black Votes Matter MN (BVM) emerged in the wake of the murder of Jamar Clark by Minneapolis Police in 2015. Our non-partisan initiative plays a critical role with increasing voter turnout and changing the face of leadership tables-within and beyond-historically underrepresented communities.



To date, BVM has registered and pledged over 4,000 voters-with 45% representing new Americans and young voters between the ages of 18-24. In addition to building a coalition of over 25 businesses and community organizations - including ACLU, AALF, the League of Women Voters and the Minneapolis Urban League, we were invited to partner with the Council of Minnesotans of African Heritage (CMAH) to facilitate its statewide civic engagement agenda; engaging African Heritage communities in Duluth, Rochester and the greater Twin Cities. Our multi-faceted approach to voter engagement - including signature debates and historic radio forums moderated by former Minneapolis Mayor Sharon Sayles Belton - BVM has been influential in re-igniting voters, helping them make informed decisions at the polls. In 2018, Minnesota had the highest voter turnout in the nation - with the highest turnout our state has seen in over 20 years.



Cultivating Global Citizens

In April 2018, we took our first co-hort of BVM Jr. Ambassadors on a College & Civics tour of Washington, D.C. Scholars visited the National Museum of African American History & Culture, the African Arts Museum, Howard University, the National Monument and the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. memorial ... with dinner at the famous *Busboys & Poets* restaurant and bookstore!



Black Votes Matter MN launched its Jr. Ambassador program at Patrick Henry High School along with a weekly civics class, "Power in Participation", taught to 10th-12th graders. Several of the scholars participated in our voter outreach efforts, even out pacing the adults in volunteer hours and voter registrations!

HEALTH EQUITY



Cultivating Healthy Communities ... One Person at A Time

Quality Life MN

Thanks to our partnership with the University of Minnesota's Program in Health Disparities Research and the Center for Spirituality & Healing, we've fostered increased awareness and adoption of healthy living choices in food, exercise and stress management in North Minneapolis and beyond! We designed and implemented 2 research studies. *From the Heart: A Total*

Wellness Mindful Intervention Model for the African American Community. This program introduced Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction (MBSR) strategies to African American women as a means of reducing high rates of cardiovascular diseases. The second program, *Quality Life MN*, is designed to promote self-governing healthy living practices. We engaged community through cooking demos, blood pressure checks,



along with free yoga and meditation workshops. It also includes a multi-media platform with radio, website and social media pages that share ongoing news and healthy living tips. Our annual signature events, *The Pinked Out Party* — an annual breast cancer awareness event, and the *Super Bowl Men's Health* event, continue to engage community authentically, making healthy living fun!

Redefining Our Relationship with Money, Success ... and the Future!

WE! Women Empowered

The Women Empowered WE! Program launched as an avenue to empower women to take hold of their finances and chart a solid course for themselves and their families. To date, we have served over 800 households, with over 16 families and individuals going on to close on homes and launch businesses!

We partnered with **Umoja Community Development Corporation** to host a series of Homestretch workshops. We also launched our Business Planning 101 series! All thanks to support from **Nexus Community Partners** and the **Wells Fargo Housing Foundation!**

TEXTURE

TEXTURE social enterprise program has grown to include weekly sewing and design workshops — for youth and adults. We've also established school and community partnerships with **FAIR School Downtown, Patrick Henry High School** and **Sabathani Community Center.** Participants have learned to operate a sewing machine, construct garments and accessories, with several going on to establish their own social enterprise as a result! Our accelerated 8-week programs get participants closer to their design projects and career goals.

TEXTURE is growing! Thanks to support from the **Best Buy Foundation, and the Women's Foundation of Minnesota,** and the **Graves Foundation**, we are inching closer to opening our full-fledged vocational academy including arts and technology programs! 
